

Make memories by offering unlimited screen-free gaming for your community! Collect old board games from your team members, thrift stores, and discount stores. Participants can pay a small fee to play as many games as they can in 2 hours, 4 hours, or as long as your event allows!

Supplies Needed:

- Board Games
- Cups / Plates / Bowls
- Snacks
- Beverages (soda, water, etc.)
- Chairs (folding chairs, or other seating)
- Tables
- Change

This kit is designed to accommodate 100 participants. If projecting fewer or more participants, be sure to adjust your supplies and cost to operate accordingly.

Plan

- 1. Indoor or outdoor? Choose a location to host this event.
 - a. Winter is a great time of year to bring everyone inside for a fun game night! You can even add hot chocolate for a cozy atmosphere!
- 2. Choose a date and time that will be convenient for most people, such as a weekend evening. Decide how long you'd like the event to last (2-4 hours).
 - a. Other appropriate times that may be suitable for your city are weekday evenings or weekend afternoons.
- 3. You may want to offer lemonade, iced tea, or other beverages for a small cost as well!
 - a. If so, prepare to put someone in charge of bringing the drinks, cups, napkins, and any other items you may need.
 - b. Add these items to the supply list above.
 - c. Purchase these items at a local dollar store or wholesale store for maximum profit
 - d. Mark up the costs slightly (Ex: A box of candy at \$1.00 could sell for \$1.50, a cup of popped popcorn at 25¢ per serving could sell for \$1.50 each, and a cup of soda at 20¢ per serving could sell for \$1.00 each. In total, after the cost to buy, you'd have a \$2.55 profit from this one sale!)
- 4. Decide on a price per person for the unlimited play. \$5 for 2-4 hours is average.
- 5. Work with your team to arrange for any equipment that you may need, such as seats, tables, etc.
 - a. You can also offer guests to bring yoga mats, blankets, pillows, etc. for their own seating if your venue allows for this.



- 6. If the location provides tables, ensure they will be usable for the event. If tables are not provided, work with your team to arrange for tables to be brought to the location.
 - a. You may want to ask party rental places or banquet halls to see if they may be willing to donate their tables for your event!
- 7. The day before the event, be sure to have change available for your buyers. For a typical sale of 80-100 guests, you will need \$20 in quarters, \$50 in ones, and \$50 in fives.
- 8. Ask team members what games they have at home that they'd be willing to bring and allow others to play. You can also try dollar stores, thrift stores, or garage sales to purchase games at a discount.
 - a. Decide if these will be stored at a team member's home or in another agreed upon location until the day of the event.

Prepare

- 9. After coordinating supplies, location, and equipment, promote "Playing for Promises" with your friends and family, through social media, on your own personal website, or with flyers.
 - a. You may want to announce a few of the games you have acquired on your flyers and online!
- 10. The day of the event, be sure there is time set aside for set up (an hour or two). Organize and display all games on one central table.
- 11. Set up other tables with chairs for guests to comfortably play games. Use plastic tablecloths as a quick decoration.
 - a. You can also use tablecloths and other decorations to draw attention to the concession table if you are offering one!

Perform

- 12. Assign volunteers with tasks: assist with set-up and clean-up, manage the game board table, and be in-charge of the concession stand.
- 13. Count the money made for your volunteer project! If you collected more than your project requires, donate the remaining funds to a nonprofit organization that benefits the community your project aims to serve!

Checklist

Plan
Choose location to hold the event
Contact location and confirm date and time
Purchase snacks, beverages, popcorn, cups, and bowls / plates
Coordinate with a volunteer to photograph the event
Purchase and/or gather board games
Prepare
Post on social media or create flyers to advertise the event
Begin assigning members with tasks like: collecting money, preparing snacks, assisting guests with games, set up / clean up
Arrange for tables/equipment and obtain change in quarters, ones, and fives.
Remind volunteers of their assigned tasks
Ensure volunteers know what time they are expected to arrive
Continue advertising via flyers, social media, personal websites, etc.
Set up chairs, tables for snacks, game table, etc. as needed
Decorate area if desired (a couple hours before the event)
Perform
Direct guests towards open tables
Encourage and talk with guests- have fun!
Maintain refreshments as needed
Count the money you made for your volunteer project
Return any borrowed games to their rightful owners
Fill out the <u>reporting form</u> , ensure a volunteer uploads any photos, and celebrate!
